











Empathy Interview Guide

IN AN EMPATHY INTERVIEW, YOUR GOAL IS TO GET AT THE WHY BEHIND THEIR ACTIONS OR PERSPECTIVES.

Human-centered design means starting with people, first! By interviewing, you get a chance to get close to people and hear about their perspectives and challenges in their own words. Interviews are at the heart of the Discover phase! Use this guide to get tips, jumpstart your interview, and record quotes.



"Tell me the last time you..."

STAY NEUTRAL.

 Try to avoid correcting your interviewee or offering up too much of your own judgement.

SIT WITH THE SILENCE.

 Sometimes it takes a while to answer a tough, personal question.

NOTE ABOUT LEGALITY:

If you're interviewing an adult, remember: Get their consent to share their interview on The Teachers Guild site. Remind them that once it's posted on the site, The Teachers Guild may use it further its goals and activities.

If you're interviewing a minor, remember: You must get parent or guardian sign-off! Make sure their parent/guardian and the student understands how the interview will be used and how it will be shared. Make sure to consult the school's policy too. If you plan to use StoryCorps, their terms and conditions specify that minors under 13 are not eligible to be interviewed.

Also, while not as ideal, anonymous interviews are OK too!













Jumping off points

USE THESE QUESTIONS AS STARTING PLACES FOR YOUR EMPATHY INTERVIEW.

QUESTIONS FOR

STUDENTS

- Tell me about the last time your parent met with one of your teachers. What was that like?
- Was there ever a time when you didn't like the way your parents were invited into your learning experience? If so, why?
- What's one thing you wish your school could do to better connect your family into your learning experiences?

QUESTIONS FOR



- Describe a teacher that did a great job connecting you to your students learning. What did that look like?
- Was there ever a moment when you felt frustrated with how you were able to connect (or not) with your child's learning/ school experiences? If so when and why?
- What's one wish you had for how schools and teachers might better connect parents to student learning?

How to Share Your Interview

SHARE YOUR INTERVIEW AND INSIGHT WITH THE COMMUNITY.

Here are 3 ways to share your Empathy Interview with the community to help inform their designs:

1. Use Storycorps

The Storycorps app is a great tool to capture your interview. Simply download the app and walk through their interview set-up process. Don't forget to hit record. Once you're done, grab the link and post it back into the Discover phase.

2. Capture Direct Quotes

It's so much better to have a quote speak for itself. Make sure you record your interview and then afterwards, include direct quotes in your post.

3. Take Photos

With permission, take some photos. One artifact photo, one portrait photo, and/or one environment photo can help others learn from your experience.
